








People in Vienna used to ride electric-powered streetcars or trolleys, before cars were invented.








Vienna had its own airport where the mall now stands. Pilots trained to fly airplanes there.






Sternwheel riverboats brought people and goods to Vienna traveling on the Ohio River. The first steamboat traveled on the Muskingum River in 1820.






Long ago, a large apple orchard was located in what is now Jackson Park.
One of the favorite apples grown there was the Rome Beauty apple.












Answers: 1. c: apple orchard 2. c: both a & b 3. a: streetcars 4. b: local airport
